DAM RESERVES CAN LAST 100 DAYS

Penang doing all it can to ensure dam reserves last until rainy season in April



HE water level at the Air Itam and Teluk Bahang dams will last for about 100 days if the prolonged drought and excessive use by the people continue.

Penang Water Supply Corporation chief executive officer Datuk Jaseni Maidinsa said it was doing all it could to ensure the dam reserves could last until April, until the rains arrived.

"Rest assured, the water supply will be adequate for the Chinese New Year celebration.

"We just want to remind people to use less water to ensure that the existing capacities can last until April," he told

The dam serves about 200,000 people in Air Itam, Paya Terubong and Jalan Masjid Negeri.

Jaseni said cloud seeding would be conducted only when the dams reached a critical level of below 30 per cent.

"For now, we will rely less on the dams and optimise the drawing of water from Sungai Muda on the mainland."

Penang is the only state that has not carried out water rationing.
