APRIL 2025 SWSI WATER WORKS UPDATE: 85% PROGRESS,19 OF 23 PROJECTS COMPLETED

PENANG, Saturday, 26.4.2025: The progress of works on the 23 water works projects being undertaken under the April 2025 scheduled water supply interruption (SWSI) has reached the 85% stage, as at 10.30am today.

Work has been completed on 19 of the 23 projects. The remaining 4 projects are scheduled to be completed by 4.00pm today.

- 1. The final connection of the 1.35m Sungai Perai River-Crossing Pipeline (SP-RCP) in **Ampang Jajar** in Seberang Perai Tengah. As at 10.30am today, the status of works for this project is at 46%.
- 2. The final connection of the 1.35m Sungai Perai River-Crossing Pipeline (SP-RCP) in **Kampung Teluk** in Seberang Perai Utara. As at 10.30am today, the status of works for this project is at 30%.
- 3. A 1.2m valve replacement work on a 1.2m pipeline at Jalan Pengkalan Tambang near the Sungai Dua Water Treatment Plant in Seberang Perai Utara. As at 10.30am today, the status of works for this project is at 90%.
- 4. Diversion of a 0.9m pipeline section at the Majlis Sukan Negeri Complex in Batu Uban, Daerah Barat Daya. As at 10.30am today, the status of works for this project is at 95%.

In general, PBAPP is pleased to report that all the water works projects are proceeding as planned.

- By 4.00pm today, we expect all works to be completed. Once the projects are commissioned, PBAPP will proceed to recover water supply services in accordance to the following schedule.
- 10.00pm, today, 26.4.2025:
 40% water supply recovery (for 136,683 of the 341,708 affected consumers) in 3 districts SPU, SPT and the North-East District (DTL) on Penang Island.



- 10.00pm, tomorrow, 27.4.2025:
 88% water supply recovery (for 300,185 affected consumers) including the majority of consumers in Seberang Perai Selatan (SPS) and the South-West District (DBD) on Penang Island.
- 10.00am, Monday, 28.4.2025:
 Fully water supply recovery for all affected consumers, including the remaining 41,523 consumers in the end-of-line (EoL) and high ground neighbourhoods in SPS and DBD.

PBAPP will continue to provide updates on the PBAPP Facebook page. We will also issue a media release tomorrow to report on the progress of the water supply recovery process.
